
IMPORTANCE OF AN ANNUAL REPORT

Do we really need an Annual Report?

- YES!!!
- Documents Friends' accomplishments over the past calendar or fiscal year
- Should be a document (not just an oral report)
- For transparency (obligation or willingness by a charity to publish and make available critical data about the organization)
- Provides an accounting to:
 - Members and donors
 - Library trustees
 - Regional library trustees (if applicable)
 - Local governments (city/county) that fund the library
 - General community
- Does not need to be sophisticated/polished



What is the most important part of an Annual Report?


Description of your accomplishments


- What did you do?
- Why did you do it?
- What were the results?
- Why did you spend time and money the way you did?
- What difference did it make?
- Connects the dots for the readers




What needs to go in the financial section?

- Revenues—where did they come from?
- Expenditures—how much was spent on what?
- Charts & graphs (pie, bar, infographics)
- Short narrative explaining the numbers









How do we acknowledge donors and major contributors?

- List major contributors (cash and non-cash)
- Alphabetize the list
- List members who made significant contribution of their time & talents
- Use lots of pictures







What else could go in an Annual Report?

Graphs

- Book sale net profit
- Memberships
- Volunteer hours
- Fund or reserve balance (net gain/loss for the year)
- Savings account
- Contributions to an endowment











What should an Annual Report look like?


- Do research on how other Friends' Annual Reports look
- Could be two pages or twenty (or more)
- Could be plain or glossy
- Tell stories













How might we use the Annual Report?

- Publish it on your website
- Provide an electronic copy to all your members, supporters, donors
- Provide a copy to a prospective or new member
- Attend meetings and provide a copy as well as an oral report
 - Annual Friends meeting
 - Library trustees
 - City Council*
 - County Commissioner*
 - Chamber of Commerce
 - Presentations to other groups



^{*}Remember that a lot of government meetings are televised—good exposure for Friends
