There are probably many more who grease the wheels, be sure to acknowledge them. And don't forget to thank yourself for all you personally do.





An excerpt from....If You See a Coin on a Gravestone, This Is What It Means Madison Zoey Vettorino



Different coins have different associations.

If you notice a **penny** on a gravestone, this signifies that a person has visited the headstone. It's an act of gratitude for the person's service. Anyone can leave a penny, whether they are a family member, friend or fellow service person.

If there is a **nickel** on the gravestone, this means that the visitor who left it went to boot camp with the person buried.

Next, if you see a *dime* on their gravestone, that signifies that the visitor served with the deceased military member.

Seeing a *quarter* has a particularly heavy association. If you notice a quarter, this signifies that a previous visitor was present when the soldier passed away.

Now that you understand what each coin means when you see it, you'll have a better idea of what it means when you see this emotional item left behind at a gravestone. And more importantly, you'll know the proper way to leave a coin.

Giving Tuesday--November 28, 2023 By Judy Hills

Giving Tuesday is "celebrated" every year by nonprofits. For many, it is the opportunity to launch an end-of-year giving campaign. It gives people a last chance for 2023 tax-deductible donations.

For Friends, it may represent an opportunity to secure funds for a specific project since very few need funds for general operating expenses. So how might your group capitalize on Giving Tuesday? Nonprofits in some communities might join forces and host drive-by events where people can drive to specific locations and make donations to groups that have set up tents or displays. Others may go it alone by doing a mail, email, or social media campaign. For email and social media campaigns, we hope you already have a "give" button set up on your website or webpage. If giving in-person, we also hope you have a credit card reader available as people don't carry much cash these days.

Your campaign should be attention-grabbing and engaging. Examples include:

- Peer-to-peer where your supporters created personalized donation pages with a link to your "give" button.
- Text-to-give campaign where your Friends send supporters a link to your online donation page via text message. (This assumes you have a database that includes a cell number.)
- A pledge drive where your Friends gather pledges from supporters, who promise to fulfill the donations by the end of the year.
- A social media fundraiser where you share the link to your donation page on Facebook, Instagram, and other sites
- A direct mail campaign where you send letters to supporters with compelling images and fundraising requests. (This assumes you have a database that includes addresses.)

Normally we advise starting planning early, but there is still time to organize something simple, do keep this on your radar for 2024. Do set a goal. What do you hope to accomplish? How much money do you hope to receive? Set a timetable for actions and assign responsibility.

Do an after-action report to assess the campaign and determine what you will do differently next year. And be sure to thank the volunteers who help with the campaign as well as the donors. Post pictures on your website, webpage, or social media site of the project that the funds help to complete.

7 Little Known Facts About America's Founding Fathers

Paul Revere was also a pioneering dentist. "The British are coming" is what he is best know for...but he was a local dentist. Five years before his famous ride, he ran an ad that read "Fix (teeth) as well as any Surgeon-Dentist who ever came from London." Also, he was the first person in the US to practice dental forensics.

Ben Franklin invented a musical instrument used by Mozart and Beethoven. In the mid-1700s, while in Europe, Franklin experienced a popular musical performance of "singing glasses." Intrigued by the beautiful sound of a wet finger on glass, Franklin developed an instrument known as a "glass armonica" in 1761. Working with a glassblower, Franklin altered the thickness of glass bowls interlocked along a rod in order to produce a range of pitches.

Alexander Hamilton likely lied about his age. Hamilton always said he was born in 1757 but documents from the Caribbean island where he was born state 1755. Two theories: he lied so he could score an apprenticeship with a local businessman at 11 years (instead of 13) since that was a more appropriate age to begin training for a trade; and the second one being that he altered his age on his Princeton application to appear more of a prodigy in the eyes of his peers.

Thomas Jefferson wrote his own epitaph and didn't mention being President. "Here was buried /Thomas Jefferson/author of the Declaration of American Independence/of the Statue of Virginia for religious freedom/& Father of the University of Virginia." He never mentioned being President, Virginia Governor, Secretary of State and Vice President.

Thomas Paine wasn't popular until long after his lifetime. Published in 1776, his political pamphlet <u>Common Sense</u> laid out the American colonies' united cause against the British. His follow-up pamphlet <u>The American Crisis</u> opened with the iconic line, "These are the times that try men's souls."

George Washington lost more battles than he won. Washington embodies the phrase "losing the battle but winning the war." Washington's resilience, determination, and long-term strategy eventually won the American Revolution.

James Madison is the shortest President in US History. He was the nation's 4th President and chief architect of the Bill of Rights and is regarded as one of the most influential Founding Fathers. He stood at 5 ft 4 inches tall.....a full foot shorter than America's tallest President Abraham Lincoln.
