

















































# Understanding the LGBTQIA2S+ Acronyms by Judy Hills

Recently I completed a form to be a presenter at a conference. Now, it has been a while since I last completed any form where the question of gender came up. Here is the way the question was asked—I had to select one: Agender, Cisgender Female, Cisgender Male, Genderqueer or non-binary, transgender female, transgender male, I'd rather not say or other (please specify). Whew! It used to be just male/female. I had to look up the meaning of "cisgender." Not sure how this is pertinent to being a presenter. A better question might be what gender identity pronoun do you prefer?

Another indicator of the parsing of gender is that some governmental employees on official correspondence now request others to refer to them by identified pronouns including: she/her, he/him, they/them or zi/zir. Guess that makes sense especially since some unusual first names are difficult to categorize.

So, you may ask why I am bringing this up. Well, I got to thinking about book challenges and book banning. Many of those are because the books are on LGBTQIA25+ topics. How many of you are even aware of the terms being used to define this community? How much do you really know and understand about those who identify themselves differently from what we are accustomed to? How is it possible to understand someone's orientation without a common language?

In researching these terms, I came across the A Greater Hope website. While the focus of this organization is providing a continuum of care for at-risk adults and vulnerable children, one of their staff, Christina Strauss has created an extensive list of LGBTQIA2S+ terms—a factor in being at-risk. "The acronym **SOGIE** is helpful in organizing the mass of terms utilized in the LGBTQIA2+ community and understanding what it all means.

# Sexual Orientation:

-Refers to romantic (emotional) and/or sexual (physical) attraction to others, men/women/both/neither/ and those who are gender non-confirming.

# **G**ender **I**dentity:

-Refers to one's inner sense of self belonging to gender groups, may differ from one's sex assigned at birth and gender expression.

# Gender Expression:

-Refers to how one expresses one's gender to others, usually expressed through behavior, clothing, grooming practices, roles and ideas. Expression may be

influenced by sex assigned at birth and/or identity.

"Sexual orientation used to be understood in the binary of Gay or Straight/homosexual or heterosexual.

Heterosexual - a person being attracted to the opposite sex or Straight Homosexual - a person being attracted to the same sex or gay

It used to be thought that the large majority of the population was straight and only a small percentage were not heterosexual. As we now know, sexual orientation is a full spectrum of diversity affecting a larger percentage of the population. This old way of thinking still affects the LGBTQ community today."



If you know someone who is other than cisgender (an adjective denoting or relating to a person whose gender identity corresponds with the sex registered for them at birth), you may want to discuss this topic with them, if they are willing. There is an old saying, "You can't really understand another person's experience until you've walked a mile in their shoes." If the conversation accurately depicts that person's experience, you may find yourself walking in muddy boots slogging through a dismal swamp.





something about who his father is...







acceptance.







next door?



author's retreat.







the dream of Camelot.




ONE LAST WORD by Suzanne Park





#### HOW TO GET FREE KINDLE BOOKS WITH YOUR LIBRARY CARD

#### **Get Carded**

First, you'll need a library card. If you don't already have one, visit your local branch to get one. Some libraries will give you a card without requiring you to show up. But check the website of your local branch to see whether you can get an electronic card issued online.

#### Get An App

Use your credentials to access your library's ebook collection. Many libraries use Libby, a cross-platform service that lets you borrow digital versions of millions of ebooks and audiobooks and send them to your Kindle or Kobo ebook reader. You can scroll through Libby's catalog in your browser or download the app (Android or iOS) to peruse the selections on your phone. Most books you see listed are available right away. Once you find the book you want, you should be able to click a button, check the title out, and send it to your Kindle or other ebook reader.

#### **Browse the Shelves**

When you first open the app, you'll be asked to set up an account and connect it to your library card. Some books, especially new releases or popular titles, will show a wait time and give you the option to get on the waitlist to borrow it. You might even have to wait as long as a few weeks or months to borrow a bestseller or a perennially popular title. This is because libraries don't have access to unlimited copies of digital books; they only buy as many digital copies as they can afford, so they end up with a finite amount to pass around. The more popular a book is, the more scarce those digital copies become.

So relax and grab a spot in the queue. In Libby, once you request a loan, the app will send an alert once the book is available for you to borrow. You can also check the app periodically to see the current wait time as copies get returned to the library and the line grows shorter.

#### Downloading

There are a few ways to read your borrowed book. You can read the book directly in the Libby or Hoopla app, but the best way to read is to send it to your <u>Kindle</u> device. We find a dedicated ebook reader to be a more pleasant, less distracting experience. Setting up a Kindle to accept borrowed books isn't hard. Within the Libby app, tap on the Actions menu at the top of the screen. Find the menu item "Read books with," then select Kindle. The app will guide you through the process of linking your Libby account with your Amazon account. After it's set up, whenever you borrow a book, you'll see a confirmation screen that also has a button labeled "Read on Kindle." Tap that button and the Libby app will shuttle you over to Amazon for a moment so you can tell Amazon which Kindle reader you'd like the book delivered to. After that, as long as your Kindle is connected to Wi-Fi, when you go to the Kindle's main menu, you should see the book automatically appear within seconds.

#### Give It Back

Just like the rest of the books in the library, there are limits on how long you can keep the ebooks you check out through Libby. These limits vary from library to library. Unlike physical books, you don't have to do anything to return an ebook you've checked out. After your time's up, the book will simply disappear from your ebook reader.

#### No Kindle? No Worries

If you don't have a Kindle, that's fine. You can still just read ebooks directly inside the Libby app. Or, if you have another type of ebook reader—a Nook, a Kobo reader, a ReMarkable tablet, or any device that supports reading digital books—you can transfer your book directly to the device from the Libby app or website.

Just know that support for direct transfer is not as thorough on a device that isn't a dedicated ebook reader. You may need to download your ebook (in standardized ePub file format) onto a computer, then transfer it to the ebook reader manually over USB. This is why we prefer reading on Kindle devices: Everything is as easy and seamless as it gets.

#### **Beyond Books**

In addition to ebooks, most libraries also let you check out audiobooks. You can stream those directly through Libby app, and sometimes you're allowed to download them too.


From our Friend Diane Kelly:


